Trics Bests Lunik in Space TV The two old concades, who had safe the liberal left considers and some accused of killing state trooper accused of killing state troop

When it comes to taking pietures in outer space the United States appears to be "one unon the Soviet Union.

Pictures of the earth obtained from the Tiros weather eye satellite are probably of higher resolution than those the Russians took of the moon, a corpration researcher reported at a meeting on campus Monday.

The reason, said Douald J. Hinthle, is U.S. superiority in television taping. There is the same difference between the Russian and U.S. methods he believes as there is between kinescope (the old way of reproducing TV shows) and modern taping methods. when it comes to taking pictures to the earth.

NASA said its Hawailan station was forced to suspend operations Tuesday auring repairs of the ground transmitter, but is expected to be in full tracking operation today.

The agency said battery temperatures aboard the probe formatkedly when the Hawaii station dropped out.

Because of battery overceastly temperatures about 100 diagrees, a level not considered critical but about 20 degrees above normal.

NASA explained that when station fall to interregate the probe, and thus do not drain the betterles, the charge builds up and so do the temperatures.

They could rise as high as 120 degrees before the battery charge overload was relieved automatically.

aloof in the latest U of M-Wayne State, University skirmish over legislative appears tionment of funds, the university was drag-ged into the battle, by two publications Time magazine and the Detroit Free Pres

Early last week legislators in the state capitol found an article elipped (corp. the April 1 issue of Time, entitled "Rare Days at Wayne," on their desks. The story had to do with the rapid rise of Wayne in American educational circles and included the following statement.

PBy all indications it (Wayne) now rank academically above Michigan State Uni-

It was only a few days after this article appeared on the politicians' desks that an increase of close to \$1,000,000 was voted. Wayne in the House of Representatives, Shortly after this the Free Press devoted

space in its editorial columns to an attack on MSU's student allotment, claiming that this university would probably have the *hardest time of the three in explaining its amount of expenditures per student.

Our objection to this controversy has nothing to do with Wayne's extra allotment. It is a rapidly growing school and has had to contend with problems of a "younger

We protest that Time and the Free Proc have seen fit to publish opinions de-frimental to MSU; opinions that appear to no factual basis

The Time assumption that WSU has academically surpassed MSU could not possibly be based on an objective evaluation of the relative value of the two schools Because of the unavailability of methods whereby universities can be compared, the statement must be taken as another value judgement, for which Time is already

NOR CAN the Free Press hardly be commended for its stand. No mention was given in its editorial of the Russell Report, prepared for the Michigan Legislative Committee on Higher Education.

In this report were concrete figures that MSU has a greater need for physical expansion than any other state school. There were also figures in this report that refuted any claim that MSU is least in need of money of our three large state universities

It is regrettable that these two publications have at this time perpetrated this false notion on our legislators. The effects of this action could well be financially dis-



Fund for Polaris Speedup Urged By White House

WASHINGTON (49-President Eisenhower, as expected, Wednesday formally approved shifting defense funds to speed.

Wednesday formally approved abifting defense funds to speed production of Polaris submarines, increase the size of six Atlas intercontinental missile squadrons and improve the ballistic missile warning system. Eisenhower also stamped his approval on a program not previously announced — revised defense department plans to order substantially more nuclear reactors for polaris submarines that will be asked for later.

The president's action was announced by Secretary of Defense Thomas Gates Jr. and Deputy Secretary James Douglas after they met at the White House with Eisenhower.

From the day's developments emerged one major new detail of the Air Force's plans to strengthen its Atlas squadrons. Douglas asid the last six of the 13 plapped squadrons — to be in plage by the end of 1962 — each would have a total of 13 missiles, three more than present plans. It had thought earlier that the squadrons might get as many as 15 missiles and pads.



'Cure' Test By Fungus Attempted

A common type of fungus known to many people as "wat-er mold" could replace mice as a means of testing potential cancer cures. The two MSU scientists who

The two MSU scientists who developed the technique report it has worked in eight out of eight tests.

In each test a different tumor inhibitor supplied by the National Institutes of Health was detected in six hours, say Dr. Everett Beneke, professor of totany and plant pathology, and Dr. Yamuna Lingappa, research associate.

Dr. Yamuna Lingappa, research associate.

L'sing mice it takes seven days to tell whether or not a substance has tumor-inhibiting properties.

The fungus method is now being tested further. Nill sends unnamed substances to Michigan State. Dr. Lingappa must tell with the fungus assay which ones are tumor inhibitors.


If it proves effective the technique could be used to screen the thousands of compounds sent to Nill and pharmaccutical companies every year for testing.
