Tomorrow Michigan State will be seventy-four years old. It was in 1857 on this day that the college was formally dedicated, making it the first state institution in the United States to offer instruction in scientific and practical agri-

The school really had its beginning during the previous The school really had its beginning during the previous year. At that time contracts were let for the erection of a building known as College itali at a spei in the wilderness three miles east of Lansing, then only a tiny clearing in the woods, "Saints Rest," the companion building, was the first dormitory and boarding hose. Such was the humble beginning of our honored institution.

Since that time great strides have been taken, unbeliveable expansions have been made, and many improvements added. The college has consistently forged ahead until now it ranks near the top among the leading schools of the country.

Now, what of the future? Up until a very few years ago, Michigan State has been extremely busy "catching up with the other colleges of its calibre. For many years, it seemed more or less backward. But due to admirable administration by our president, we are at last practically on a par with the best schools in the United States.

Only one thing remains to be accomplished to qualify Michigan State as one of the best, that being a class "A" rating from the American Association of Colleges and Univirsities and it is toward this end that the college is working at the present time. We hope that this last remaining step can be taken when the next Founders' Day is celebrated.




