LITTLE THEATER WORK NEARS END

New Stage Hangings, Curtains, to Complete Improvement Program.

Work on the Little Theater has virtually been completed with the hanging of the new curtains and drapes in the auditorium. A complete new stage decorations for the auditorium itself and drapes and curtains as stage equipment and decorations has constituted the \$1,250 improvement program begun before the holidays for the theater by the college building and grounds committee.

Cooperation between the home economics and dramatics departments has transformed the interior of the theater into a stylish high class playhouse. Through the contract division the J. L. Hudson company of Detroit, installation of a blue green velvet main curtain for the stage and drapes of the same color for all of the auditorium windows and large velvet drop curtains back stage has been completed. The window drapes are cut to fit the arch of the auditorium and are draped

back to the sides. The back drops are on a stationary carriage system whereby the second curtain can be raised in groups draped at the front or pulled back out of the way when they hang straight. The main curtain draws to the center. The total cost of the drapes aggregated \$675 and were selected by Dean Mary Jane Moore, Miss Shubin and Miss Smith of the home economics department.

The auditorium has been refinished, both in paneling and plaster. The paneling below has been refinished in natural color and is held to be one

of the most beautiful features of the room while the plaster above has been painted a light cream.

The technical equipment of the stage includes a three circuit footlight system set in convertible wells with new switches throughout. No overhead lights have as yet been installed. It is planned to add small dressing rooms at the sides of the stage.

The new theater was used for the first time by the Home Economics club when they held their social meetings there Wednesday night.
