It's remarkable what television can do for a football coach, especially if he's a mailike Hugh Duffy Daugherty.

Extremely popular with the press and public, Duffy has found success in another media--television. Twice a week, on Wednesday and Sunday nights, sports fans focus their attention to Channel 6, WJIM-TV, when Duffy plays host to

Duffy said that he preferred doing the Wednes-



Duffy mused on his future in television.

"Oh, I don't think I'll ever make a career out of TV," said Daugherty, hoping that the inevitable question of "Why not?" would not come. But it did.

"Why?" said the Spartan skipper. "Because I just don't have that much appeal for TV. Doing these programs is part of my job as football coach. Practically all Big Ten coaches have similar shows.

"Besides, in professional TV, I'd have to put on makeup. And in my case, you can't make a silk person out of a sow's ear," Duffy quipped.
