Woolco opening

first Lansing store Woolco Dept. Store, one of the largest stores in the Meridian Mall, will help celebrate the mall's three-day grand opening this

Woolco, a full line department store, is a division of the F.W. Woolworth Co. The new name was created to emphasize the modern merchandising and advertising techniques of the Woolworth Co.

The new one-floor building carries name brand merchandise in 50 departments, which range from ladies and children's apparel to a hardware department.

The mall store has a unique electronics stereo room where music can be heard without interruption. Another form of customer convenience is the Red Grille, a cafeteria accommodating 116 people, which offers a meal or snack for the hungry shopper.

The 150,000 square foot store is the first Woolco store in the Lansing metro area. It is the 112th store to open since Woolco division began in 1962.

Woolco is open Monday through Saturday from 10 a.m. to 9:30 p.m. and from noon to 6 p.m. Sunday.

Webster Men's Wear's new store opening in the Meridian Mall is one of the company's two new stores opening in Lansing. A new store is also opening in the Lansing Mall.

The two new stores are 3,000 square feet each and will feature medium priced men's and young men's fashions.

Originated in Baltimore, Md., Webster's is new to the Lansing area. They now have a total of 455 stores operating throughout the mid-western, southern and mid-Atlantic states.

The company concentrates its merchandising efforts towards the young men's fashion market photography shop. between the ages of 17 to 35.

The stores in Lansing will carry the same lines as the Webster stores in the East. The store will stock Edwardian and Regency-styled suits and sport coats and also traditional and conventional styles.

The majority of Webster's clothing is tailored in its own factory, located in Westminister, Md., and sold under its own label. The store will also carry complete lines of nationally branded sportswear and furnishings.

The 33 stores opening today are only about one-half of the number to be reached when the mall is finally completed. Expansion plans will add some 250,000 square feet to the present facility, according to Samuels. Another major department store and 12-20 smaller stores will eventually be added, although the space has not yet been leased.

The mix of merchandise and services is a rich conglomeration of men's and women's clothing stores; gift, variety, jewelry and fabric stores; shoe, department and food stores.

new business and industry to an area, along with tourists and conventions.

The Wall Street Journal compiled some figures illustrating the significance of shopping center business. In 1968, the nationwide total of retail sales in these centers amounted to \$90.58 billion, or 40.8 per cent excluding automobiles and gasoline.

It is estimated that 1969 sales will climb to \$97.5 billion, or 42 per cent of the total retail trade excluding gasoline and automobiles. The 1974 projections place the figure at 50 per cent.

The market of 1975 as predicted by demographers, will probably see an increased demand for higher priced quality merchandise lines. The average family income will average \$10,500, representing about two-thirds or more of the total comsumer demand, demographers predict.

The boutique idea, characterizing the small specialty shops, follows the trend toward specialization which customers often find more convenient.

Profits waning on Wall Street

NEW YORK (UPI)-Profit taking leaned on the stock market last week after its sharp mid-October advance. Trading was moderate. Saul Smerling, vice president of Standard & Poor's, said the list was in a period of consolidation as investors paused to reconsider Vietnam and the nation's monetary situation.

One analyst commented that peace enthusiasm, which helped support the market in recent weeks, waned a bit because there was no evidence. . . only hope. . . that President Nixon would announce a dramatic peace plan when he delivers his Vietnam address Monday. At the Paris peace conference, the Communists rejected a proposal by Chief U.S. negotiator Henry Cabot Lodge, who called for a new approach to the Vietnam talks, and suggested, that secret discussions begin immediately after Nixon's

Lucien Hooper, senior analyst for W.E. Hutton brokerage said. "Wall Street was in a period of disenchantment after the euphoria of the previous two weeks." He noted that nothing has happened yet to hasten peace.

Renewed inflationary concern also worked against the market. While U.S. Secretary of Commerce Maurice Stans predicted more prosperity and less inflation in 1970, opinion on Wall Street was that inflation still was out of control. Lending evidence to this was a Commerce Department report that "leading economic indicators" moved ahead in September after a drop in the

In addition, Paul W. McCracken, Chariman of Nixon's council of economic advisers, said that "for much of 1970, it may be rather uncomfortable year."

Electronics suffered the sharpest declines. Analysts said a big drop in Control Data, the most active issue, early in the week triggered a selling wave throughout the group.

Investors were said to be disappointed with Control Data's third quarter earnings, although they were above the year ago period. The issue finished with a loss of 27 5/8 to 116 3/4 on 1,395,300

Fairchild Camera was second on the active list. It lost 3 to 92 on 606,300 shares. A spokesman for the company could offer no explanation for the drop in price.

Students aid mall promo

He found out that students spent an estimated \$119.9 million on goods and services, excluding University payments, during that period. 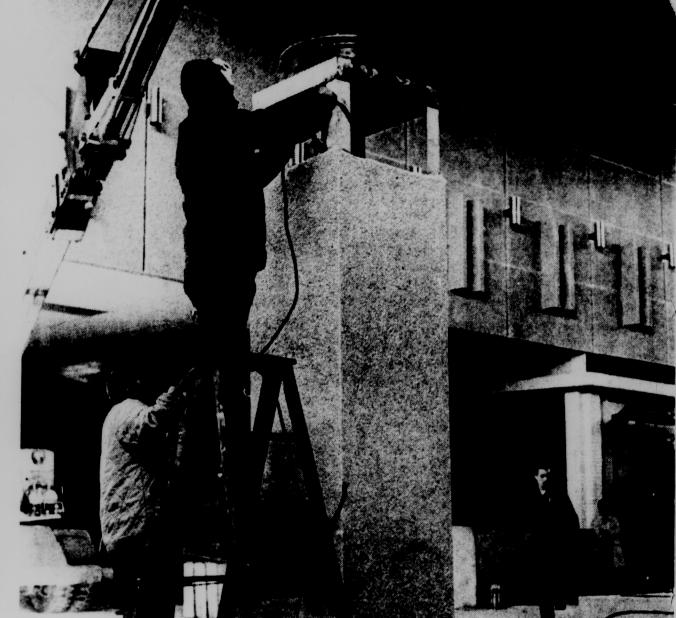
