The Future of Michigan State

"The next Michigan legislature will decide if M. S. C. is to maintain or improve its position as one of the nation's leading educational institutions." - John A. Hannah. speaking to the Lansing Chamber of Commerce last Wednesday.

Mr. Hannah is right, but he'll have a hard time doing anything about it. As he knows, it's pretty hard to alter political traditions.

The legislature, for instance, has established a three-to-one appropriations ratio between the University of Michigan and Michigan State College. And they manifested a desire last year to keep it that way.

But the enrollment at Michigan State is now 4,000, as compared with the University's enrollment of 9,000. According to simple arithmetic, that leaves 1,000 students up here without any legislative consideration whatsoever.

And what does that mean?

It means simply that dormitory space is inadequate, that the health service at Michigan State is unsatisfacory, that classes are too crowded, that desirable professors can-

It means that the legislature is an obstacle to educational progress in this state.


