

Spartans Among Large Field in CIC Meet at Milwaukee

State Trackers Seek Fifth at Milwaukee As Frosh Again Win

Stern Opposition Faces Spartans as Leading Teams Enter Central Intercollegiate.

With fifth place as its goal, Michigan State's track team is in Milwaukee today to compete in the 11th annual Central Intercollegiate track and field championships.

The Spartans will be bucking against the sternest opposition in the country during the meet. So class is the competition that the entries are expected to better the performances recorded in the recent Big Ten meet, generally accepted as tops.

Included in the team entries are Indiana conference champs, Ohio State and its Jesse Owens, Wisconsin, Notre Dame, Marquette, Kansas State Teachers, and two scores other schools. University of Michigan will be among the few mid-western teams absent.

Indifferent This Season

Sixth in last year's meet with 17 points, the Spartans are confident of exceeding the 1935 showing in today's meet. State has performed indifferently this season in both dual and championship meets and anything better than a 4th would surprise the team followers.

Return of James Wright and Ken Waite, distance stars, who have been out of competition most of the spring because of injuries, probably will strengthen entry. Wright will run the half mile in which he placed last year, while Waite faces Don Lash, Big Ten champ, and 15 others in the two-mile.

On paper, State will not score a first place. Among those who probably will earn points are Detroit, broad jump; Loda Habbe, pole vault; Waite, Gerard Hess and Harold Sparks, javelin; and Carl Mueller in the sprint.

Score Around 18 Points

The dopsters have it that State will score around 18 or 20 points as the highest, which in a meet of the Central caliber probably will not earn the Spartans their desired fifth place.

State will miss the points of Albert Aggett, hurdler; Wesley Orr, discus man; and Wade Allen, high jumper. Each failed to make the trip for various and sundry reasons.

Athletic Director Ralph H. Young named a 24-man squad in addition to Assistant Coaches Miles Casteel and Lauren Brown for the trip.

Spartans Collect Nine Hits in Opener; Hill to Oppose Notre Dame Away Tomorrow.

They uncovered a new star at College field yesterday. He's a man who is serving his second year on Coach John Kobs' State baseball squad, and he started his first game before the home folks against the touring University of Iowa nine in the opener of a two-game series here yesterday. He pitched all the way, although he came very near losing it in the ninth inning when the visitors jammed the socks with two out.

Seeking a sweep of the series, Kobs today was sending Warren "Lefty" Walters out to the mound. Tomorrow's game with Notre Dame at South Bend will be the semi-windup of the year, and George Hill will be sent against the Irish. The only other game left on the card this season is the windup against Western State next week.

A Different Team

It was a different ball team that took the field for State yesterday. Different from the one which was so liberal with two games against Michigan last week. Nine solid hits rang off their bats, and these were spread around the lineup pretty evenly. They made three errors but managed to cover them up when the issue was in doubt. Iowa made seven errors, but these also accounted for only one of the State runs.

State managed to get ahead in the first inning and were never headed after that. Henkel kept the visitors away from the plate for five innings, giving them but two hits over that stretch. He weakened in the sixth, allowing two hits and issuing one pass, enough to bring the Hawks two tallies.

They were quiet until the first

half of the ninth thereafter, getting two more hits the rest of the route. But for a bobble by Weimer in that frame, his second of the day and the Spartans' third, he would have got by with little trouble.
