Olin's Domain

Last March the College informed its members about 2,500 cases a record for this hospital during any other equal period.

2,500 stated Dr. R. J. Olin, college health authority, to date.

During this period 91 students were hospitalized and the average time for recuperation was four days. A majority of those receiving attention were suffering from sore throats and sinus infections.

The hospital carries a staff of three physicians, Doctors Olin, Johnson and Hodges, as well as six nurses. This enables two doctors and three nurses to be on duty at all times to minister to the needs of the patients.

Only the most modern equipment and the most sanitary conditions are encountered throughout the infirmary.

Appendicitis was also more prevalent during the past March than at any other time, there being 15 cases treated. As

ten the college hospital has no operating room or equipment it is necessary to send the more serious cases needing operations, to Lansing hospitals. Of the 15 cases treated in March, 10 resulted in the removal of the appendix.

Due to increased enrollment the hospital staff is taxed to the limit. One year ago last March we treated only 2,000 cases of which 22 were hospitalized, the average time for recuperation being 44 days. Students will be treated as efficiently here as modern equipment and medical knowledge is ignorant of their ailments. This infirmary is for the health of the student body," added Dr. Olin.

Linton Named Head of Ag Program Plans

Prof. Robert S. Linton, of the education department was appointed general program chairman for the regional conference for state supervisors and teacher trainers in agriculture at the regional conference which took place at Chicago during spring vacation.

We have a number of fine traditions on this campus, all of which I ask that you uphold at all times. Probably the oldest, simplest, and most respected custom on the campus is that of no smoking either on the grounds or in the buildings. The Union building is the sole exception to this. It is my hope that you will observe this custom as the upperclassmen have observed it.

Is It Worth While?

Each spring the Michigan State college English department presents a series of literary contests open to the college undergraduate body.

These contests offer a type of creative effort for State students which can not be highly recommended.

Active participation in such an endeavor as the Lawmen Essay, the poetry and short story contest, would wreak well for Michigan.

At least it would forego direct educational benefits for a segment of body, yet it actively interested in each phase of academic endeavor.

From past observation, however, general student interest in such contests as the Lawmen English department has yet approached zero.

These literary contests are fully worthy of the Lawmen English department, journalism, economics, and speech, the entire student body.

Ray S. Shaw, State's best, the Lawmen students have not succeeded in winning one of the important prizes, even though their work comprises over eighty per cent of the entries.

In 1936 the essay contest was headed by a student in the science school, while a freshman carried off the lesser of the spring entries.

With the prize money allotment increased last year, the writing writers will find their efforts less well rewarded.

Not only that, but the editor of the Lawmen obtained his first copy of the year's manuscripts.

Band to Appear at Opening of Modern Plant Here Saturday

Called by leading authorities on track construction the latest thing in college layouts Michigan State's new track and field plant will be dedicated Saturday to the accompaniment of martial music and the booming of artillery.

The ceremonial call for the R. O. T. C. band to provide the 100-piece band and the necessary field pieces and powder. President Robert S. Shaw will deliver the dedication speech shortly before the opening of the meet with the University of Chicago.

Governor Frank Murphy will attend the ceremonies as will innumerable other officials and other officials and guests. Chester L. Brewer and George Gauthier, both identified with athletics in the past will be guest speakers.

The new track fourth to be employed since the college was founded, was the result of an intense search headed by Athletic Director Ralph Young.

At the leading tracks in the country and Canada were studied in addition to consulting forty-five athletic coaches. As a consequence of this detailed study, Young was able to incorporate the best features of the leading plants.

Another distinctive feature of the track is that it will be used only for track and field, whereas other tracks are found in football stadia. Texture of the cinders on the track, location of the pits for the various field events, and other details result in maximum efficiency.

Two 220-yard straightways permit 10 lanes of hurdles. The "railway" curves are so constructed that the runners do not have to stack up in order to round the curves. In the dash and hurdle events there will be no "outside or inside" lanes.

The oval part of the track is a quarter-mile. Runways next to the outside or inside lanes will not be used under ordinary conditions.
