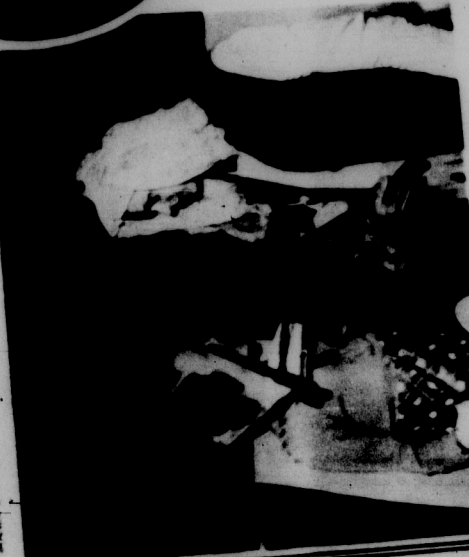


On With the Dance

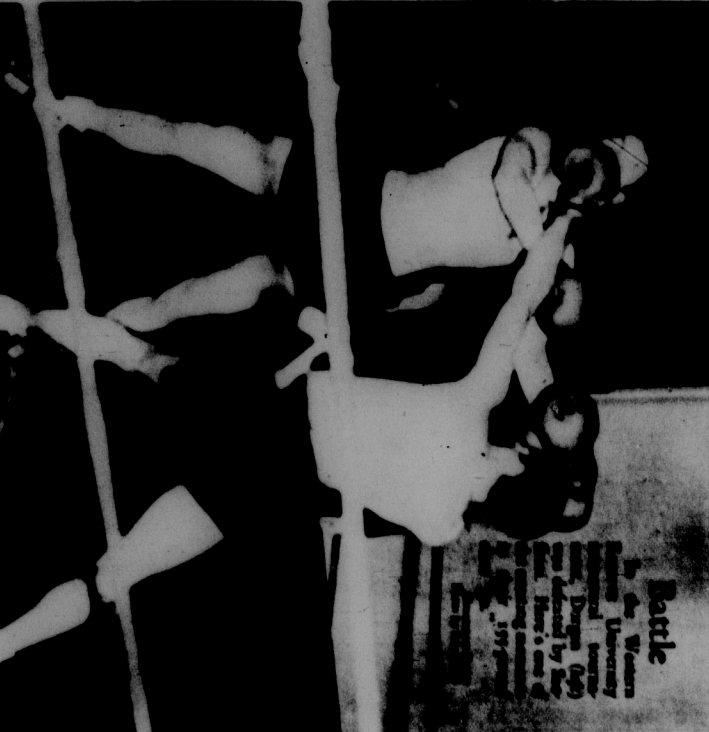

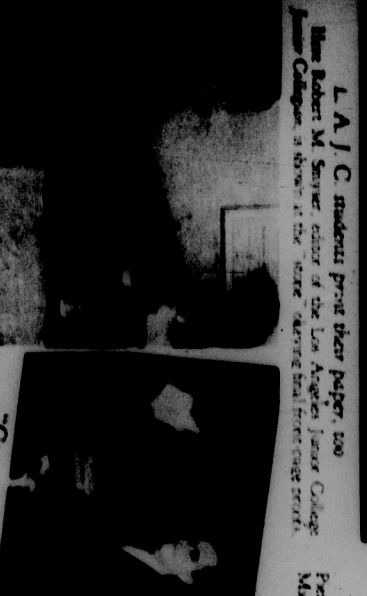

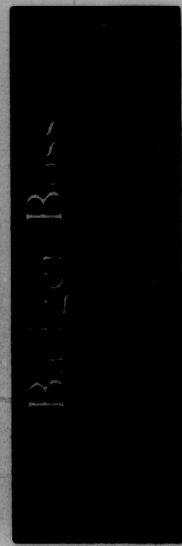

Princeton's No. 1 Host and Hostess

IN 1931, the year Century Editor Glenn Frank came from New York to Wisconsin to be the state university's "boy" president, Clarence Addison Dykstra was Los Angeles city commissioner of water and power. Eleven years later, when Wisconsin asked Mr. Dykstra to replace Mr. Frank, Mr. Dykstra was still concerned with water. Cincinnati, the city he had managed for six years, was so deep under floods that it had an feet, 36 inches of height were no protection against inundation. A month after the waters subsided, City Manager Dykstra signed a one-year contract to return to education as new president of the University of Wisconsin at \$35,000 per year.
