ovember 14 marked the election of the MetGCSA's 20th president, Tim O'Neill, into office. Larry Pakkala formally turned over the reins at the Annual Meeting held at Apawamis Country Club.

"Having worked at a neighboring course for nine years, I know Tim, and I've seen what he can do," says Larry of his successor. "He's hard-working, knowledgeable, and always professional—precisely the skills we need in a president. I have no doubt he'll do a fabulous job."

Superintendent of Country Club of Darien in Darien, CT, Tim has served on the MetGCSA Board of Directors since 1984. In his climb through the chairs, he's headed numerous committees, including the Tournament Committee, the Membership Committee, and the Scholarship & Research Committee. Membership Activity

During 1991, there were:

helm. Serving him equally well, however, is his 11 years of experience as a turfgrass management professional.

Tim got his start in the business in Pawtucket, RI, where he was born and raised. "When I was in junior high school, I worked as a caddy at the Pawtucket Country Club to earn a little spending money," says Tim. But caddying provided him with more than pocket change: It gave him the opportunity to get acquainted with—and then interested in—turfgrass management.

"When I turned 15, I started working on the grounds crew at Pawtucket," explains Tim, "and by the time I graduated high school, I knew I wanted to pursue a career as a golf course superintendent."

Tim's first mentor—and source of inspiration—was Les Kennedy Sr., who was then Pawtucket's golf pro and superintendent. Working alongside Tim was another budding turfgrass professional: the *junior* Les Kennedy, now of Oak Lane Country Club in Woodbridge, CT.

Tim continued to work summers at Pawtucket as he pursed a B.S. in turf-grass management from the University of Rhode Island. When he graduated in 1979, he accepted his first position as assistant superintendent at Greenwich Country Club, under then superintendent Paul Caswell.

"I'm thankful to Paul, of course, for his professional guidance, but also for encouraging me to participate in the MetGCSA," notes Tim. "The Met's fueled my professional development and offered me a lifetime of friendships."

After two years at Greenwich, Tim moved on to his first—and current—superintendent's position at Country Club of Darien. When he started in 1981, he reported to the club's sole proprietor, Edgar Auchincloss, who had the 18-hole course built on what was once his family's estate.

Designed by Golf Course Architect Al Tull, the course was completed in 1957 for an amazingly low \$200,000. "He prides himself on being able to convert the estate to a private club for that sum," Tim says with a smile.

Though working with a sole proprietor—and solo decision maker—may be unthinkable to some, Tim found it an interesting—and quite pleasant—experience: "Mr. Auchincloss was genuinely concerned with improving the course, and as soon as he saw what I could do, he was very supportive of whatever I suggested." Apparently, he was also *very* involved: "If we were digging a ditch," Tim says, "he'd be right there with us."

In 1986, Auchincloss sold the club to the membership, and for the first time in his career, Tim reported to a green chairman. Under the club's new—and more conventional—committee system, Tim has gotten the goahead for some major capital improvements. The year the course was sold, he hired noted Golf Course Architect Brian

Silva to develop a master plan for course renovations, which have included a major drainage project and extensive tee and bunker reconstruction. "We've come a long way from a farm," says Tim.

Now, Tim's looking toward yet another professional challenge: the MetGCSA presidency. "I'm excited about my new responsibility, and I look forward to the challenges ahead," says Tim, whose plans for the association—like he, himself—are nothing short of ambitious (don't miss his president's message).

Tim and Jennifer, his wife of four years, live in Norwalk, CT, with their two children, Justin, 2, and Kristen, born October 28.


