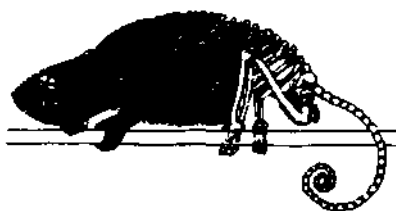
TIM QUINLAN is attached to the Institute of Social and Economic Research, University of Durban-Westville.
