That part of the resolution not already adopted was then, on motion of Bro. Haas, adopted.

Also, a resolution as follows:

WHEREAS, We, as Patrons, recognize woman as in every sense equal with man, as to her rights and privileges in the Grange; therefore,
Resolved, That we can no longer consistently deny her the right of the

elective franchise; and, Resolved, That we have no desire longer so to do, and that we would recommend the petitioning and instructing of delegates to that effect.

On motion of Bro. W. P. Whitney, the preamble and resolutions were adopted.

Also the following:

That the resolution in regard to the electing of President and Vice President of the United States by popular vote of the people, (which the Committee referred back to the Grange without recommendation.)

On motion of Bro. W. P. Whitney, the resolution was laid upon the table.

Bro. W. J. Beal read the following resolution, by unanimous consent, and moved its adoption:

Resolved, That the Chairman of the Committee on Agricultural Department be requested to furnish a copy of that part of his report referring to the Agricultural College, to Pres. T. C. Abbott, with reference to its publication in his report.

Adopted.
